

Weekly Update - September 26, 2008



Update from the City Manager - The City recently completed a telephone survey of the community regarding transit. The summary and presentation of the findings are available at <http://westlinnoregon.gov>. The survey was undertaken as part of the development of the City's new Transportation System Plan and at the request of the Transportation Advisory Board. The consultant worked with members of the TAB on the development of the questions, with staff adding two questions: "Resident Perception of Priorities" (pg. 5) and "Increased Density Support" (pg. 20). These two questions were intended to solicit the community's opinions regarding priorities – both financial and land use. It was staff's plan to have the new TSP to the Council for adoption in October. However, TAB's request for this survey delayed the project by approximately 60 days. An initial discussion about the TSP is scheduled for the Council and the Planning Commission on October 6. We expect to have the final document to the Council for adoption by early December.

This week the mayor sent a letter to the Department of Land Conservation and Development (DLCD) designating the Planning Commission as the City's Committee for Citizen Involvement in accordance with Statewide Land Use Planning Goal 1.

Public Works

The Water Master Plan Open House was held at the West Linn Public Library this week. The open house provided residents the opportunity to review the final draft plan and to understand how this utility will serve the community. Next on the schedule is the Transportation System Plan Open House. This open house will be held at the West Linn Public Library on Wednesday, October 15, 2008 from 5:30-7:00 p.m. and will provide the same opportunities for residents to review the final draft plan and provide input.
