

The meeting was called to order soon after 7 PM.

Police Chief Terry Timmeous spoke about the coming ballot measure for a new police station on the May 18 ballot. This includes purchase of property and annexation. Questions and concerns were regarding property costs and building costs and location in consideration of access by public transportation, the general public and lack of visibility from most of W.L. There was also concern about the "All or nothing" linking of the three measures.

Sunset Neighborhood Association President, Troy Bowers came to speak to the Sunset School replacement issue and the importance to their neighborhood that it remain on that historic site. Sunset Park and School is the hub and gathering place for their area. There was support for this effort and encouragement for vigilant monitoring to preserve as much of the natural area as possible.

We voted to join with the Downtown Oregon City Business group to purchase hanging baskets with them for our lamp posts at the end of the Arch Bridge. We voted to purchase shrubs up to \$100. for the refurbishing of the McLean House grounds. The March minutes were approved as printed.

We discussed the need for a June meeting as the school will not be available and our fire station will not be ready. We determined that with planning for our summer events at our May meeting a June meeting would not be needed. We are in support of a Fall Dumpster day.

We discussed neighborhood signing and prefer historic "caps" for our street signs along Hwy 43. Banner brackets may also be a good project to look into. We favor continued rollover of funds to allow for more significant projects. We are not in favor of requiring applications to receive funding as grants.

We noted upcoming events: Lockfest, Take Care of West Linn Day (both May 15) and the Garden Club Plant Sale and the Master Gardener Plant Sale at Canby.
