The meeting was called to order soon after 7PM in the Bolton Primary School Cafetorium.

Donna Webber, Bolton Teacher, came to let us know that they are sponsoring a benefit Bikeathon in the school and park area on Saturday morning April 28. They wanted us to be aware of what was happening.

Sgt. Wade Corbin updated us on recent police activities in Bolton and also pointed out the causes of Bolton's recent piece of the activity being much greater than the majority of the other neighborhoods. This has to do with I-205 and the High School and the increased commercial activity at the new shopping center and also Hwy 43 that other neighborhoods don't deal with. Since the Virginia Tech incident happened today Sgt. Corbin filled us in on the ongoing training West Linn Police has done in this regard. They are trained to go after the shooter first while radioing for other help for other injuries that occur.

There was discussion about the proposed changes in home business signing. Examples of the sizes current and proposed were displayed. More information is in order to explain the request for change.

Discussion about the recent Curbside recycling was very positive. It would be improved by earlier notice. We all agreed that our usual May Dumpster Day was too soon as were the June dates we talked about. September seems a better time.

Audubon is doing Bird Song Walks in Camassia Park Thursday mornings at 7AM til June.

The minutes of the March meeting were approved as printed. There was an inquiry about the loss of the Copy Center and again disappointment was voiced at the loss of this needed service.

Peggy Kirkendall and Alma Coston returned from attending the City Council Meeting being held at the same time as our meeting. They reported that the attendance was good and the discussions of Neighborhood Association changes were not favorable. More study was needed.

It was moved and seconded and voted unanimously with no abstentions that a letter be sent to the City Council stating that we are satisfied with the way our Neighborhood Association works and is funded and do not want any changes.

There were questions regarding access for the commercial building planned next to Key Bank. Access through the Key Bank Parking lot could not be worked out. Other access is of great concern to Holly St. residents. This is being looked into and will be revisited next month.
