Financial Condition of West Linn

- Bond rating restored to AA-
 - \$436,000 in interest savings
- Policy reserves continue to improve
 - In FY 2009 budget, reserves for 12 of 15 funds meet or exceed policy levels

Additional Information

- ◆ Issuance of \$4 million in debt:
 - \$2 million for road maintenance projects city-wide
 - \$1.5 million for land purchase for future police station
 - \$500,000 for wading pool and restroom upgrades at Willamette and Hammerle parks
- Continuing discussions about a biennial budget process:
 - To be discussed at future Budget Committee meetings
 - To coincide with Council goal setting
