### **Agenda Revisions for July 14 Meeting**

As was discussed at the Council's July 7 work session, we have made a few revisions to the July 14 agenda:

- 1) Added an executive session at 5:30.

- 3) Added an ordinance that would re-designate a small city-owned property to ROW as it is only used for vehicle and pedestrian access.
