Disasters, by definition, are events that overwhelm police, fire, medical and 911 emergency responders.

The programs offered at the ACC are managed by the City of West Linn Parks & Recreation staff. Please visit the website to view all the classes and events offered at the ACC. Following are a few of the services offered:

- Health Services: Foot clinics scheduled monthly, with nurse providing foot care services for \$25. Free blood pressure checks offered monthly. Flu shots are offered annually.
- Exercise Programs: Kettlebell, Nia, Walking, Aerobics, Tai Chi, Strength & Balance, Yoga and Line Dancing.
- Games: Hand and Foot, Whist, Pinochle, Bridge, Poker, and Mahjong.
- Special Interests: Woodcarving, Share Singers, Ukulele Activity, Gardening Group, Painting, Knitting, Crocheting, Book Club and Drama.
- Meal Program: Meals-on-Wheels meal program is available for homebound citizens who are 60 or over. On Tuesdays and Fridays, the bus will take you grocery shopping.

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)

SNAP offers food benefits to eligible, low-income individuals and families.

Benefits are distributed through the state's Electronic Benefit Transfer system by using an "Oregon Trail Card" at the grocery store point of sale machines.

Employment Related Day Care

- The Employment Related Day Care program (ERDC) helps eligible lowincome families pay for child care while they are working. ERDC is a subsidy program, meaning eligible families still pay part of the child care cost.
- ERDC also works with providers and other child care partners across the state to help families find and keep good child care, improve the availability of quality child care in Oregon, and to develop resources for parents and child care providers.

Domestic Violence Information & Services

Domestic violence is threatening, abusive, or violent behavior in the home between adults. Dating or relationship violence means that this behavior is directed by one person towards another in a dating relationship.

- If you are experiencing an emergency, call 911.
- If you are in immediate need of a domestic violence shelter contact the Portland Women's Crisis Line at 1-888-235-5333. This crisis line refers callers to local programs.

Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF)

The Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) program provides cash assistance to low-income families with children while they strive to become self-sufficient. The program's goal is to reduce the number of families living in poverty, through employment and community resources. To qualify for TANF, families must have very few assets and little or no income.

Family Support and Connections

- Family Support and Connections is a statewide program designed to help families meet the challenges of being a parent in the world today.
- A local family advocate is assigned to each family to help develop an individual plan.

Oregon Supplemental Income Program

OSIPM covers a wide range of medical benefits and services such as doctor's visits, prescription drugs and other medically necessary services and supplies.

The JOBS Program

JOBS Opportunity and Basic Skills (JOBS) program is the state's employment and training program for people on public assistance. This program can help low-income families avoid the need for welfare.

Food Assistance

 211info can help people apply for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP/Food Stamps) and will provide one-on-one help to access this program. 211info can connect those eligible to other supplementary food assistance programs like WIC and farm direct vouchers as well as summer meal sites for kids, community meal sites, farmers markets that match SNAP dollars, nutrition education in the community and resources to help people with low-incomes grow their own food.

Housing & Shelter

 211info provides a single point of contact for programs that support families experiencing homelessness, including a 24/7 contact center, shelter referrals, transportation options, and data entry to input family information into the homeless management information system (HMIS) used by all participating agencies.
