
WEST LINN UPDATE Second Quarter, 2015


Be on the lookout for CoWL at Parks and Rec events as well as library events this summer. CoWL is a real hoot!

City Council Emergency Preparedness Goal #1:

Develop a city-wide Map Your Neighborhood rollout strategy to ensure all West Linn neighbors have an opportunity to learn about and engage the Map Your Neighborhood program.

Grant Oakes is West Linn's Map Your Neighborhood expert. As a member of the Public Safety Advisory Board,

Grant provides valuable training on how you can build a neighborhood support network that will come in handy during an emergency.

The City of West Linn also publishes Map Your Neighborhood materials online here: WestLinnOregon.gov/ MapYourNeighborhood.

The Map Your Neighborhood program outlines a nine-step Neighborhood Response Plan that immediately helps you to know what to do both at your home and in the neighborhood.

You will learn how to respond to injuries, utility problems and assisting people such as the elderly, those with disabilities or children who may be home alone.



City Council Emergency Preparedness Goal #2:

Coordinate with Tualatin Valley Fire & Rescue, local civic and neighborhood groups, and other local agencies to plan an Emergency Preparedness Fair for the West Linn community.

Save the date! The City of West Linn and Tualatin Valley Fire & Rescue will host an emergency preparedness fair on Thursday, September 24. The fair is free and will have booths and informational sessions for you and your family.

Another Great Way to Receive Emergency Notifications:

The City of West Linn uses the Clackamas County Emergency Notification System (CCENS) to call citizens during an emergency. Please sign up today!

The CCENS system is programmed with telephone numbers. You must sign up online to receive emergency alerts by: cellphone, Voice Over Internet Protocol (VOIP) or email. Use this link to sign up: **Clackamas.us/emergency/ccens.html**

If the call is picked up by an answering machine, it will leave a message and not call back. If the number is busy or there is no answer, the system will call twice more. The system also contacts TTY/TDD devices used by the deaf and hearing impaired.

By signing up, you will receive emergency notification for your home or any other address (such as a business). You will only be contacted when your associated address is affected by an emergency. In cases where emergency actions may be necessary you will receive notification on what measures to take during a disaster or in the case or about a hazardous situation near your home that may require a public response.

Savanna Oaks NA
