NEW BUSINESS:

Discussion was held regarding the planned Lake Oswego Water Treatment Plant. Chuck Landskroner, Kevin Bryck, David Froode, Norm King, representatives from Lake Oswego -Tigard Water Partnership and Tom Miller presented their views. Tom Miller offered a resolution for consideration for the HSNA to oppose the Lake Oswego Water Treatment Plant. Elise Thompson moved and it was seconded that the HNSA place this item on the agenda for the March 21 HSNA monthly meeting.

Erik Van de Water presented his progress with organizing the removal of invasive English ivy on the Palomino Loop Trail, In order to plant the natives as part of his project and there being no HSNA meeting at the time, he invested \$200 of his own money to fund that purchase of native plants to replace the invasives with an expectation of matching funds from the HSNA when a meeting was held. He asked that a resolution be passed for the matching funds of \$100. Jim Brown so moved and there was a second. A vote was taken and it passed.
