- a. A new City Sustainability Staff Person is critical in order to be able to do all of the other items on our list, things that are important but that this board cannot do alone.
- b. Enroll in Columbia-Willamette Clean Cities; we must find the best ways to get involved and have access to this resource; it's not very expensive. We need to look at all of our goals as we move into this year.
- c. Jerry G. to review application for Leaders in Sustainability. Work with YAB and schools to get students to create videos.
- d. Sustainability Education Series could become several instructional/informational videos posted on the SAB website.
- e. Water Usage Data One of SAB members should go to the parks board meeting.

Discussion

Staff position is still a high priority. We want to support the idea of a pedestrian/bike bridge between Oregon City and West Linn. A question if there's a plan for replacing the trees that were lost in the ice storm which prompted a discussion for having a fundraiser to buy trees: "Replant West Linn" was born. The idea is to have a booth at the farmers' market to advertise no more than 2-3 of our ideas. We can use pre-existing materials from the county.
