Thank you so much for taking me thru the McLean house which was so wonderful.

The house has so much history and it would be neat to join forces with the Historical Committee to give tours and have a day of local music, wine and apps outside if the weather is nice.

The local West Linn high musicians are always looking for work that I am thinking of are very good and I can send you a video of them performing. They usually charge \$100 per performer for a couple of hours and there are usually 4-5 musicians. Cost would be approximately \$500-600

For wine I was thinking maybe we could tie it in with Doug's local wineries and offer appetizers from a local caterer who is looking to promote their company. Cost could be approximately \$1000-2000 to make it worth their while just for appetizer teasers.

I dont have a date in mind since it would be at the mercy of the Historical Society schedule but I would think summer would be more welcoming.

Additional costs for flowers for decoration I am guessing around \$500 just to be safe.

Shuttle service to and from the library or market of choice parking lot, \$1500.

Total for this event would be \$5000 at the most.

Time frame could be from 1-4 during the day and people would have to make a reservation to attend just so we know how many to expect.

The other idea would be an artist in residence exhibit and they can offer an art class followed by wine and apps. This could be offered inside and you would have to sign up for the art class. The artists we used to hire to come to the school ranged from \$2500-5000 depending on their stipend and included their housing and transportation but this was years ago.

Timing of the exhibit could coincide with the wine events as well.
