- Christi Lanz; Small School Alliance (SSA): Looking for ideas for the future of WL Schools. Documenting how we kept our schools open: Need to document what we learned from our efforts defending small schools and how we can make a blueprint for the future and how can we continue efforts to keep schools open. For Bolton: Promote preschool and mandarin programs. Ideas about foundations to fund teachers, and talk of advocacy at the state level. In the community: idea of a "Welcome Wagon" to welcome people into the neighborhood and acquaint them.

A few top to-do's to be prepared in case of emergency:

Working smoke alarms (saves lives such as in the recent local Windham Oaks Ct. fire); Create defensible space around the house: ie. Rocks around base of home instead of bark chips and vents with screens (Embers are responsible for 90% of homes lost to fire); Evacuation plan, including meet up point a safe distance from the home (including person outside of the area as a point of contact in case of local natural disaster); Inventory of house for insurance with electronic access; Emergency preparedness kit; Go bag (see <a href="www.ready.gov">www.ready.gov</a> for a helpful example); Know how to shut off your utilities; Sign up for local and national emergency alerts (EAS, WEA, WL connect app for local info). Go to <a href="clackamas.us/public.alerts">clackamas.us/public.alerts</a>.

**Tips**: Keep oil stained rags out of the dryer, and let rags soiled with things like kitchen oil and stain dry before throwing away as they can spontaneously combust when balled up damp. Keep flammable materials in storage away from fuel sources. If you have flammable materials, especially unusual things like fuel, oxygen tanks, or welding materials around and there is a fire, immediately let the fire-fighters know of their location.
