The meeting was called to order at 7PM in the cafetorium of Bolton Primary School.

Seven of the new tenants of W.L. Central Village were present and Welcomed to our neighborhood. Tom and Cindy Craig and daughter have opened "Edible Arrangements" on the upper floor of the new building. They brought samples of their products, brochures and coupons for all of us.

Aubrae Matthews of Starbucks provided coffee and spoke about their store and their community service.

David and Shari Chenoweth are the owners of soon to be open Quiznos. They brought menus and shared with us the progress toward a late May target date. They are located in the Mall building facing Willamette Drive.

John and Amy McEwan owners of "Five-O-Three" a restaurant featuring local products that is to be located facing Willamette Drive on the North end of the new building shared with us that the name refers to our area code!

All tenants encouraged people of all ages to submit job applications!!

Boltons Annual Dumpster Day will be September 15 instead of May because of the May all-city cleanup.

Paden Prichard and Tony Yraguen showed us some design revisions for the property at 5750 Hood Street. It will be somewhat smaller and be all Business/Commercial (no residential as previously shown)

Curt Sommer did a presentation on Ground Source Heating and Sustainability.

The April 16, 2007 minutes were approved as printed.

Roberta Gray reported on activities at the Life Support Center and their participation in Convergence projects this week.

Hwy 43 citizens advisory committee members reported on the May 17th Public Workshop which was well attended. The final report from the

consultant is due before the end of June for inclusion in ODOT's Transportation Plan.

Discussion regarding the Lake Oswego to Portland Transit and Trail Alternatives Analysis study now in progress was clarified for us by Councilor Jody Carson. She voiced the city's concern that with this plan our only Tri-Met line (35) would have very few through trips. All others would require transfer to other modes of travel at least once and perhaps twice to arrive in Downtown Portland. The Council sent a letter to the last meeting with Jody. It was not permitted to be read but was to be entered into the written record.

Sgt. Randy Schleining returned after having extensive surgeries following an injury.

A "straw vote" was taken to gauge support for enlarging signing for home business. No support was indicated and all seemed satisfied with the limits now provided in our community development codes.

Holly St. and Hood Street area people voiced concerns about the large office building being proposed for Hood Street accessing Holly Street-- an already difficult Hwy. entrance.
