- 41. Not tear down parks!!! (i.e. Sunset)... provide more natural settings for kids to explore- not just plastic play structures- think Sellwood Natural Park :-)

- 43. Stop further development

- 45. West Linn needs a swimming pool. Learning to swim is an important life skill for the safety of all ages. West Linn high school swim team needs a pool to practice in so they don't have to travel. We support other sports. Why not swimming?

- 80. It is unthinkable that a community as educated and affluent as ours does not have a city swimming pool.
- 81. It would appear the city needs more staffing for parks.
- 82. I would like to see more youth activity leagues that are not as competitive as the school leagues. I would also like to see more youth "lifelong learning" classes like cooking for teens, sewing for teens, home finances for teens (and adults!).
- 83. More dedicated indoor recreational facilities including indoor & outdoor pool.
- 84. We really have no indoor recreation facilities. Pushing for a community pool again would be nice.
- 85. Need indoor recreation spaces, such as community gyms, city-run pools, etc.

- 86. I don't really know of any indoor recreation facilities that are city owned/operated? I guess Sunset Firehall could qualify...there just don't seem to be many I can think of;)

- 92. West Linn needs a proper recreation center

- 106. "Swimming areas that are not private and neighborhood exclusive. Activities for teens and appropriate places for them to go to socialize that are not church based"
- 107. Actually have a community center.
- 108. expansion of central community areas in the parks. Create central areas of community congregation near local businesses. e.g. near a cofee shop outdoor benches and play space. More coverage for rain or ground in playgrounds conducive to rain

- 114. A dedicated parks and rec facility for younger people not just a senior center.
- 115. A community swimming pool and rec center that would be affordable to all.
- 116. We are angry that the Cedar Oak public access has been closed for so long. We use the park and not the boat launch. Why must we be not allowed in the park for so long.
- 117. Park maintenance. Don't get so much that you can't maintain what you have.
- 118. West Linn's indoor facilities are good quality, there's just not much quantity, particularly courts.
- 119. Keep the parks CLEAN. Create sidewalks on all main streets so we can safely walk places in west linn! Walking on Sunset is downright dangerous.

- 140. The trails could be improved. For example, better maintenance and identification of the Pimlico trail. Also, a natural buffer between Rosemont Rd and the trail would reduce the road noise and increase pedestrian safety
- 141. Lake Oswego provides a much greater menu of recreational offerings, both for kids and adults.
- 142. Facilities are limited and not always open to the public.
- 143. Offer more children's programs at times that work well for families with both parents working full time. For example, summer camps that run full day and more classes offered on weekends.
- 144. quit converting our green spaces and "wilderness parks" into playing fields. Keep it green, open and natural. Thank you for buying Savannah Oaks.

- 151. The offerings for kids are so sparse where we moved from every season we got a 100 page book of classes activities events for kids, and adults. There were indoor parks which would be huge here, a community swimming pool/ water park, with an indoor gy
- 152. Indoor Swimming facility
- 153. Pool rec center, larger events. Hurry up willamette falls project and push tourism/small hotel
- 154. Love Mary S Young park. Palamino Trail is in bad need of repair. It would be nice if there was a fenced dog park. Maybe a joint venture with Lake Oswego to improve the drainage at their park.
- 155. I am unaware of any all ages community center. I regularly travel to Portland to use their indoor community centers (~once per week).
- 156. "Quit letting people build more houses here
- 157. We need the open spaces, not more businesses or houses."
- 158. Stop development of open spaces and natural areas!
- 159. Construct more hiking trails.
- 160. Convert a few tennis courts into either pickleball courts or "mixed use tennis/pickleball courts."
- 161. We would live to see regular communication with residents (emails, postcard, brochures, etc).
- 162. Put the cost of parks back in the budget rather than a fee on the water bill!!!!! West Linn is living beyond it's budget by doing this and until it is folded into the budget, no more parks, natural areas or trail should be built.

- 166. Maintain more natural areas in the city. Work with city to prevent the removal of large trees and limit development in park areas.

- 167. The community is lacking activities for tweens and teens indoors such as swimming, bowling, community center or other meeting places that are safe and healthy for young people to gather. A low cost option is key for regular use.
- 168. "North Willamette park courts and bathrooms need better up keep. We really need a community indoor basketball/volleyball space. We also need a community space for pools."
- 169. opportunities for off leash trails.
- 170. Having an indoor swimming pool where kids could take swim lessons would be wonderful!
- 171. More art offerings and girls in wilderness.
- 172. We don't have any indoor recreation facilities for med-large groups. I have a girl scout troop and we are often looking for a large space to hold events and we nearly always have to rent a school, however they are often being used by the school.

- 174. Swimming pool.
- 175. Repair Robinwood Station. What's up with that? City has been dragging feet for years, denying legitimacy and allowing building to deteriorate.
- 176. Indoor swimming pool and other recreation facilities for children. ALL day care (8-5) for camps offered during no-school-days and summer otherwise it excludes families with working parents. Off-leash trails for dogs that are under voice control.
- 177. Address invasive plants in our parks and restore back to a native state.
- 178. More sports facilities/fields for the youth of our great community to enjoy and compete/share with other communities. These events usually bring many families together from all over Oregon & Washington and give us a chance to showcase our great area.
- 179. I would like us to have more indoor rec spaces-- even if it's just one indoor center (with or without pool) so that we're not so reliant on using school district facilities.
- 180. Finish the river trail
- 181. Improve Sunset Fire Hall. It was great after it was updated, but then wasn't maintained. Also, there are several "forgotten" neighborhood parks that seem to get missed being maintained. I.e. Litter, low bark chips,
- 182. Bring back a park next to Sunset Elementary. It would also be great if we could get a pool and more indoor play areas.
- 183. Safety: need lighted/blinking pedestrian crosswalk signs by Willamette primary school and by restaurants in Old Willamette. Parked cars obstruct views in both areas above mentioned
- 184. Off more programs for youth and increases communication for parents seeking opportunities for youth to get involved in activities. Increased number of facilities and coaches available for youth sports.
- 185. We need an indoor pool or recreation center here in West Linn.
- 186. Get a community center/pool!
- 187. Build more tennis courts, with lights preferably.

- 195. Continue with more community events. The summer concerts, which may not be a Parks and Rec. activity are wonderful. Also more offerings in the community education program. Finally Sunburst Park needs attention.

- 197. The sunset firehall needs work , the dancers have to dance in moldy conditions and I don't think that is a healthy environment for them
