## **Notice of Public Meeting and Comment Period**

*Proposed Relocation of West Linn Post Office*

**What:** The U.S. Postal Service is having a meeting for the West Linn Post Office located at 5665 Hood Street, West Linn, OR 97068-7068.

**Background:** Due to loss of leasehold, the Postal Service is now looking to relocate retail and carrier services to a yet-to-be-determined location within West Linn.

The relocation project will consist of procuring a suitable substitute location, as close as reasonably possible to the existing location. Retail Services will continue at the current location until October 31, 2019 and then USPS will temporarily relocate services to Wilsonville's Main Post Office.

USPS is looking to lease an existing building that is 10,000 gross square feet with 65 parking stalls or consider land that is at least 75,000 square feet to be developed.

U.S. Postal Service representatives will present the proposal for the relocation during the 5 p.m. meeting.
