


Perceptions of West Linn as a place to live are improving.

More than eight in ten of all groups rate the city as a great place to live.






What People Like about West Linn

There are few complaints about the City of West Linn.








The Importance of Services

Schools and rec programs are more important to those with children.


Public safety, water, sewer and streets more important to those with no children.


Perceptions that the city keeps its promises have improved 15 points since 2010.

At seven in ten of all groups want active efforts to promote business growth.





Stafford Area Development

Do you support the City of West Linn's continued opposition to urban development in the Stafford area?



Nearly three in four residents want the city to continue opposition to urban development in the Stafford area.

All groups want continued opposition.

Support is unchanged since 2010.





POTENTIAL BOND MEASURES





Pool and Rec Center Bond

The City is considering a proposal to build a city pool and recreation center at a total cost of approximately \$22 million. The project could include a lap pool, leisure pool, gymnasium, and fitness facility. The cost to the average property taxpayer would be \$143/yr. Do you favor or oppose this potential project?

A thin majority favors a \$22 million bond measure to build a city pool and rec center.

Support is strongest among people with children (70%) and new residents (63%).

Residents with no children oppose the measure.


Based on these results there is insufficient support today to pass the pool/rec center bond measure.





Public/Private or City Managed

If the City decides to pursue a new community pool and recreation facility, would you prefer that the City consider public/private partnerships, or that it be owned and operated exclusively by the City?



A majority prefer a public/ private to own and operate a new pool/rec center, if it is built.

All groups prefer a partnership to run the center.





Drinking Water Bond

The City is considering a proposal to upgrade and maintain the City of West Linn's drinking water system at a total cost of approximately \$10 million. The project could replace the 100-year-old Bolton reservoir, as well as maintain and improve other parts of the drinking water system. The cost to the average property taxpayer would be \$65/yr. Do you favor or oppose this potential project?

Two in three residents favor a \$10 million bond measure to make improvements to the city's drinking water system.

All groups favor the proposal.

At this time, there is solid support for the potential drinking water bond measure.





Parks Bond

The City is considering a proposal to develop city parks, trails and pathways at a cost of approximately \$7 million. The project would expand City trails and pathways, improve existing City parks and build a new park. The cost to the average property taxpayer would be \$46/yr. Do you favor or oppose this potential project?

Residents are evenly divided about a potential \$7 million bond to expand and improve parks.

A majority of residents with children and new city residents favor the bond.

Those with no children at home and long-term residents oppose it.

At this time, there is insufficient support to pass the parks bond measure.







During the past year have you have attended a City meeting, such as the City Council, a planning commission, etc.?




Roughly one in five residents have attended a city meeting during the past year. People attending meetings come from all demographic groups.

People attending meetings come from all demographic groups.


The share attending neighborhood meetings is unchanged 2008 (35%) and 2010 (33%).


Almost everyone in West Linn has Internet access.



KEY FINDINGS





- Perceptions of the City of West Linn have improved during the past four years.
 - Almost everyone says the city is a great place to live.
 - Good schools, low crime, friendly people, convenience and improved city services are city attributes.
 - Residents are concerned about local infrastructure.
 - Ratings for quality of services have remained high or improved, except for economic development.
- Overall, the city is meeting community expectations for most services it provides.





- Support for three potential bond measures varies.
 - There is solid support for a potential \$10 million bond measure to improve the city's water system.
 - At this time, there not enough support to pass bond measures to build a pool/recreation center or improve/expand city parks.
- People want the city to aggressively promote economic development in targeted areas of the community.





- Communicating with residents about local issues requires a complex communication plan.
 - Most residents rely on multiple traditional and digital sources of information to get local news.
 - They city is doing a good job providing information to the community using websites, bill inserts and e-newsletters.
 - City and neighborhood meetings are important but can't be relied on as a primary medium for communicating and informing residents about issues.
