Subject: Hidden Springs NA and Rosemont Summit NA Request to Merger

Purpose

The Hidden Springs Neighborhood Association (HSNA) passed a resolution to pursue a merger with the Rosemont Summit NA (RSNA). A subsequent joint meeting of the HSNA and RSNA was held to further discuss the process for merging the Neighborhood Associations (NA).

Question(s) for Council:

Should the HSNA and RSNA merge to form one, new NA?

Public Hearing Required:

No.

Background & Discussion:

In 2012, the RSNA became an “inactive” Neighborhood Association (NA) and no longer meets because there were no volunteers to replace Dean Suhr when his term as RSNA president ended. In 2013, despite the best efforts of then-HSNA president Alex Kachirisky, the HSNA had low participation and was unable to make quorum at four separate meetings.

In late 2013, Suhr and Kachirisky began discussing the possibility of merging the RSNA and HSNA to attain greater efficiencies and to broaden the scope and network of the boundary sharing NAs. The HSNA passed their resolution to pursue the merger at their January 2014 meeting.

In April 2014, City staff met with the new HSNA officers who articulated their interest in pursuing the boundary change as voted upon by the membership. Their reason for wanting to move ahead with this change in Spring 2014 was simple: they wanted to have enough time this summer to host a picnic to bring together the HSNA and RSNA into one combined NA.

In April 2014, the City Council provided direction that the HSNA and RSNA should meet one more time at a joint meeting to ensure that residents in each NA had the chance to articulate their support or concern about NA merger. That meeting occurred in late June, and again, the NAs expressed their interest in merging.

The City of West Linn has an administrative policy related to NA boundary changes, but it was more generally written to accommodate subdivision or street-sized boundary changes, not a wholesale

consolidation of two NAs. The policy specifically states that it is “not to be used for the creation of new Neighborhood Associations.”

The policy also assumes that both NAs (the one gaining and the one losing territory) are both active, and that each will continue with changes to the boundaries. However, that is not the case with the proposed merger, making the the policy inapplicable to the request from the RSNA and HSNA. The Boundary Change policy is attached for your review.

The HSNA and RSNA request Council action so they can move ahead with creating a new NA, generally using the following steps (as described by Dean Suhr in his attached email):

1. City Council approves Resolution 2014-12 to merge HSNA and RSNA.
2. Dean Suhr & Erik Van de Water facilitate merger process:
 - a. Use HSNA bylaws as the starting point for new NA bylaws.
 - b. Convene meeting(s) to adopt bylaws, new name, and new leadership.

Budget Impact:

\$0 – It is anticipated that the funds previously allotted to two NAs will be combined into one allocation.

Council Options:

1. Approve Resolution 2014-12 to authorize the merger of the HSNA and RSNA.
2. Do not approve the resolution; direct the NAs to remain separate entities.

Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommends the approval of Resolution 2014-12.

Potential Motion:

Motion: Move to approve Resolution 2014-12 to merge the Hidden Springs and Rosemont Summit Neighborhood Associations into a new Neighborhood Association.”

RESOLUTION NO. 2014 – 12

A RESOLUTION TO MERGE THE ROSEMONT SUMMIT NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATION AND THE HIDDEN SPRINGS NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATION INTO A NEW NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATION.

WHEREAS, in 2012, the Rosemont Summit Neighborhood Association (“RSNA”) became inactive because of an inability to obtain candidates or reach a quorum to elect a neighborhood association president after the past president’s term expired; and

WHEREAS, in 2013, the Hidden Springs Neighborhood Association (“HSNA”) had difficulty reaching quorum at its meetings; and

WHEREAS, the RSNA and HSNA began discussing the potential benefits and efficiencies that a merged Neighborhood Association (“NA”) might offer to residents; and

WHEREAS, in January 2014, the HSNA voted in favor of merging with the RSNA; and

WHEREAS, at the direction of the City Council, in June 2014, the HSNA and RSNA held a joint meeting at which merging the NAs was favorably received.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF WEST LINN RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The Rosemont Summit Neighborhood Association and Hidden Springs Neighborhood Association shall be merged to form a new Neighborhood Association with a combined area of 748 acres as depicted on Exhibit A, which is incorporated by this reference.

SECTION 2. The officers of the former Rosemont Summit Neighborhood Association and Hidden Springs Neighborhood Association are directed to facilitate a process to determine bylaws, officers, and a name for the new Neighborhood Association.

This resolution was PASSED and ADOPTED this 11th day of August, 2014, and takes effect upon passage.

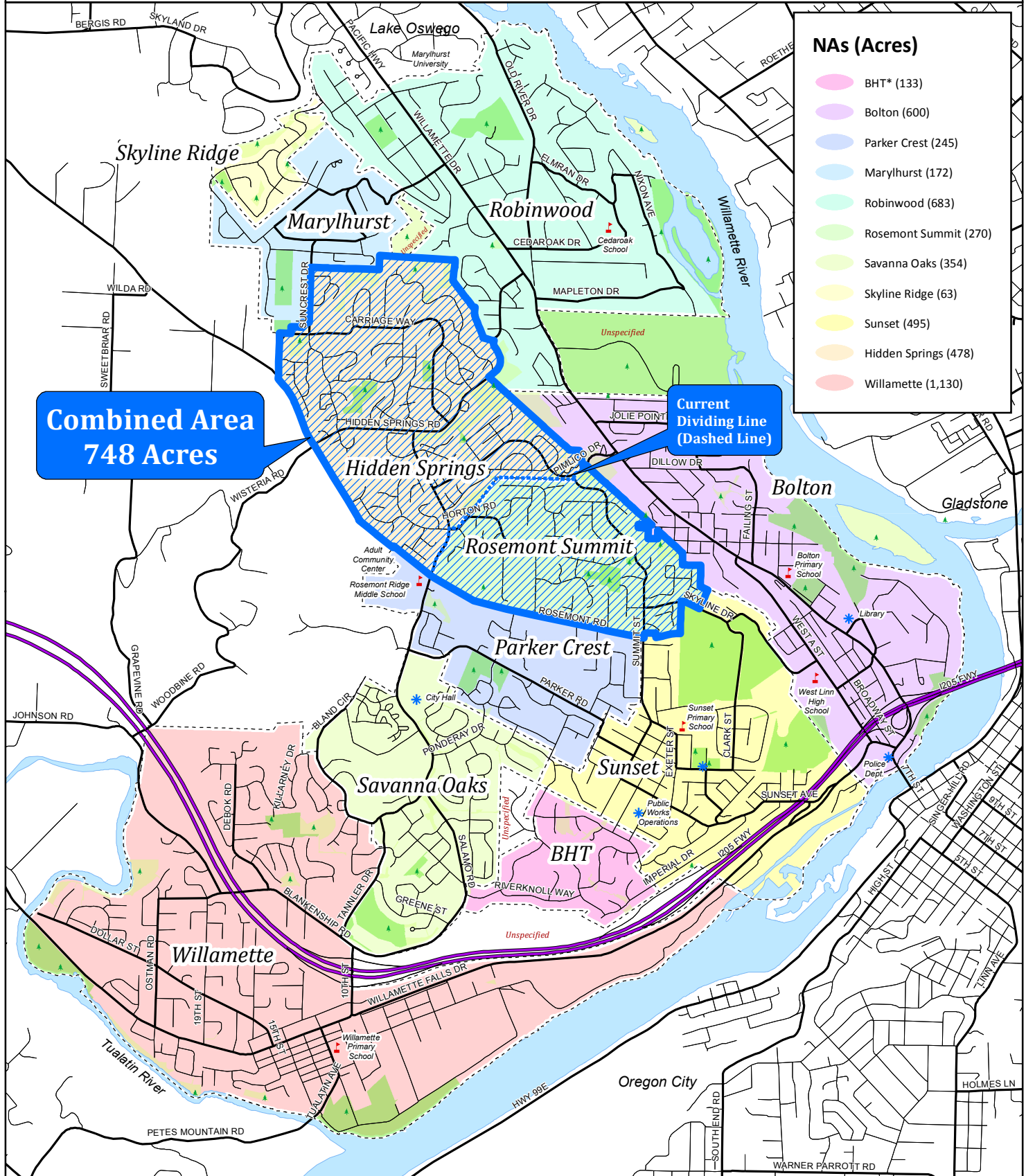

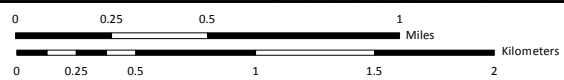

Hi Kirsten,

I concur with Erik's summary with some additions.

1st - we want to reserve the RSNA funds from both 2014 and 2015 for any potential merger. We are thinking that a combined neighborhood gathering with food and "stuff" to attract residents might be a good time to accomplish a few things. (This would be after we get council guidance on the process they want us to use.)

- 1) Inform, discuss, and answer questions about the proposed combination
- 2) Bring residents together to better understand what we have in common
- 3) Have residents contribute to a list of potential goals for the new NA
- 4) Propose a new NA name
- 5) Orchestrate a vote to disband the existing NAs and form a new one
- 6) Nominate new leaders ... to be voted on at a more formal meeting a month or so later.

2nd - As far as the Council's guidance and considerations ... several issues came up at this week's meeting:

- 1) The HSNA folks are very attached to their Bylaws. I haven't seen them recently but they were revised after the NA was mismanaged previously. A new NA would have to have Bylaws. I do not think the RSNA is wed to their Bylaws so we could propose the HSNA bylaws as the starting point for the new NA Bylaws.
- 2) It's not clear to the residents what the purpose and goal of a NA is. Frankly, the city charter is vague on this (with the exception of development issues). I suspect the new NA will want to come in with a strong sense of its purpose and "help" the city council respond, over time, to this. Some acknowledgement from the city council will likely be asked for when they accept the new NA that the goals of the new NA are broader than the code specifies.
- 3) The new NA will have a new name and new leadership.

We're hoping to have council guidance in the next 30-45 days, a combined neighborhood gathering in early September, and be an operating new combined NA in the fall.

I heard through the grapevine that at least one of the adjacent NAs is feeling squeezed financially because of their size. We may ask them if they want to join the merger. Personally, I feel that neighborhood gatherings are good things, but there is a broader role for NAs in engagement and responsibility.

Neighborhood Association Boundary Change Policy & Procedures

This policy is designed to empower individuals and Neighborhood Associations (NA) in the boundary change process. The goal is to enable boundary changes based on feedback from the affected residents and other affected NAs. This policy tasks the City Council with the review of information as submitted by residents and the NAs. By ensuring that both individual residents and NAs weigh in on proposed boundary changes, the interest of both the larger organization and the individual homeowner carry equal importance. This policy is not to be used for the creation of new Neighborhood Associations. Upon City Council adoption of a Neighborhood Association boundary change, staff will begin to integrate the new Neighborhood Association boundaries into all City documents and correspondence.
