1. Call to Order

Ireland calls meeting to order at 16:02

Ireland, Caitlin, Caden, Evan, Andrew, Advay, Hunter, Noah, Tanner, Ms F, Councilor Cummings, Olivia, Nick, visitor (Andrew Kilstrom) in attendance

3. Review Survey [Results](#)/Update on High School Parking/Draft Recommendation to Council

We had previously agreed to keep going with parking

Still waiting to hear back from ODOT regarding allowing parking on the bridges

Final results from parking survey reviewed

Ireland claims that bridge parking is probably the least likely to raise objections

Evan suggests that since it requires ODOT's okay, it might be difficult

Allowing parking on every other side of each street in the school's neighborhood would open up about 171 spaces, and including bridge parking, about 228

The 227 registered parking spaces on the survey conclusion is not from the survey, but rather from the school district

Evan supports one-side parking; temporary solution, but thinks that doing otherwise may be letting perfect be the enemy of good

Councilor Cummings suggests going around the table saying names for recording

Ireland asks if there are any other ideas

Olivia suggests phasing in the other half of the streets over five years

Nick suggests rotating allowed areas

Andrew points out that allowing parking for students is only for about 200 days of the year

Ireland suggests that parking be allowed in every other spot

Noah points out that kids will park in the neighborhood regardless of legality

Ms F suggests an open house with the residents for informal conversation

Caitlin (or Caden) thinks we should be closer to a decision by now.

Noah motions to present option 2 (totally eliminating permit parking zone) to Council. No one seconds the motion.

Hunter motions to accept option 3 (one-side). Motion seconded by Andrew. Votes: Caden yes, Evan no, Advay no, Olivia yes, Hunter yes, Caitlin yes, Noah yes, Tanner yes, Nick yes, Andrew yes, Ireland no. Motion passes 8-4.

Nick suggests residents can see littering, etc., and report it to school

Andrew and Noah claim that in such situations, residents would (and do) go to the coppers

Ms F likes the idea of working with neighbors
