The program helps us organize a timely response to disasters neighborhood by neighborhood. This program will help you know what to do in case of a disaster or other emergency. Disasters, by definition, are events that overwhelm police, fire, medical and 911 emergency responders.

Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF)

The Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) program provides cash assistance to low-income families with children while they strive to become self-sufficient. The program's goal is to reduce the number of families living in poverty, through employment and community resources. To qualify for TANF, families must have very few assets and little or no income.

Family Support and Connections

Family Support and Connections is a statewide program designed to help families meet the challenges of being a parent in the world today. A local family advocate is assigned to each family to help develop an individual plan.

Oregon Supplemental Income Program

OSIPM covers a wide range of medical benefits and services such as doctor's visits, prescription drugs and other medically necessary services and supplies.

The JOBS Program

JOBS Opportunity and Basic Skills (JOBS) program is the state's employment and training program for people on public assistance. This program can help low-income families avoid the need for welfare.

Employment Related Day Care

The Employment Related Day Care program (ERDC) helps eligible low-income families pay for child care while they are working. ERDC is a subsidy program, meaning eligible families still pay part of the child care cost. ERDC also works with providers and other child care partners across the state to help families find and keep good child care, improve the availability of quality child care in Oregon, and to develop resources for parents and child care providers.

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)

SNAP offers food benefits to eligible, low-income individuals and families. Benefits are distributed through the state's Electronic Benefit Transfer system by using an "Oregon Trail Card" at the grocery store

Domestic Violence Information & Services

Domestic violence is threatening, abusive, or violent behavior in the home between adults. Dating or relationship violence means that this behavior is directed by one person towards another in a dating relationship.

- **Health Services:** Foot clinics are scheduled the first and third Wednesday of the month and the first Friday of the month from 9:00am-2:30pm by appointment. Fees applicable.
- **Exercise Programs:** Aerobics, Core Strength, Nia, Strength & Balance, Tai Chi, and Walking.
- **Games:** Bridge, Hand and Foot, Mah Jongg, Pinochle, Poker, and Whist.
- **Special Interests:** Woodcarving, Share Singers, Ukulele Activity, Gardening Group, Painting, Knitting, Crocheting, Book Club, Drama, and Writing.
- **Meal Program:** Meals-on-Wheels meal program is available for homebound citizens who are 60 or over, or referred by Medicaid. Meals are provided five days a week (Monday-Friday) around the noon hour.
