
Once, a Bird by Rina Singh


Tenzing Norgay by Maria Isabel Sanchez Vegara

Planting Hope: A Portrait of Photographer Sebastião Salgado by Philip Hoelzel

The Fire, the Water, and Maudie McGinn by Sally J. Pla

For the neurodiverse Maddie, getting to spend a summer with her dad, instead of her mom, is ideal. But does keeping a secret help or harm you? An intense, but ultimately triumphant, story of strength, bravery, and finding your voice!



Leeva At Last by Sara Pennypacker

Leeva Spayce Thornblossom sets off on a journey to find out: What are People For? Her greedy parents are certain they know, but Leeva starts exploring her neighborhood, beginning with the library of course, and finds people to be wondrous and marvelous. In this moving sequel to *Inside Out & Back Again*, Hà is now 12 years old and faces yet another move—this time to Texas. This novel in verse shows the experience of refugee families attempting to find their place in a new community and the changes within their own family's dynamics.
