# You Can Save Your Checkout History

Want to know what you've checked out before, perhaps recall the titles you used last year for a specific unit of study? By default we don't save your checkout history, but you can opt in. Log into your account on <a href="mailto:lincc.org">lincc.org</a> by clicking My Account, then go the Account Information tab, click on Preferences at the bottom, and click the checkbox for Enable My Checkout History. Keep in mind that the system will only start recording your history from that moment forward.

# Tape Town Sunday, January 28th from 1:30-3:30pm



by Aimee Isaac



by Kate Foster


