These books were published in 2024 and topped our most checkouts during 2024 list. Here are the highlights from this hit list!

James by Percival Everett (Fiction)

When the enslaved Jim overhears that he is about to be sold to a man in New Orleans, separated from his wife and daughter forever, he decides to hide on nearby Jackson Island until he can formulate a plan. Meanwhile, Huck Finn has faked his own death to escape his violent father, recently returned to town. As all readers of American literature know, thus begins the dangerous and transcendent journey by raft down the Mississippi River toward the elusive and too-often-unreliable promise of the Free States and beyond. While many narrative set pieces of Twain's original novel remain in place, Jim's agency, intelligence and compassion are shown in a radically new light.

The Women by Kristin Hannah (Fiction) In 1965, nursing student Frankie McGrath, after hearing the words "Women can be heroes, too," impulsively joins the Army Nurse Corps and follows her brother to Vietnam where she is overwhelmed by the destruction of war, as well as the unexpected trauma of coming home to a changed and politically divided America.

Funny Story by Emily Henry (Romance) After being dumped for her boyfriend's lifelong best friend, Petra, Daphne agrees to room with Petra's freshly heartbroken ex until she can figure things out, in the new novel from the New York Times best-selling author of Happy Place.

The God of the Woods by Liz Moore (Fiction) Early morning, August 1975: a camp counselor discovers an empty bunk. Its occupant, Barbara Van Laar, has gone missing. Barbara isn't just any thirteen-year-old: she's the daughter of the family that owns the summer camp and employs most of the region's residents. And this isn't the first time a Van Laar child has disappeared. Barbara's older brother similarly vanished fourteen years ago, never to be found.

STAFF PICKS HIGHLIGHTS

The Mighty Red by Louise Erdrich (Mystery) In Argus, North Dakota, a wedding intertwines the lives of Gary, Kismet, Hugo, and Crystal. Amidst personal struggles and love triangles, they face broader themes of time, climate change, and economic turmoil. The novel explores the complexities of ordinary people in a prairie community, highlighting their dreams, struggles, and resilience.

The Wedding People by Alison Espach (Fiction) Severely depressed Phoebe Stone arrives at Newport's Cornwall Inn alone after her husband's betrayal with one dark plan. When she is mistaken as a wedding guest, she unexpectedly bonds with the bride, their unlikely connection offers both humor and heart, revealing how life's detours and chance encounters can change us in profound ways.

Family Family by Laurie Frankel (Fiction) An actress who makes a film about adoption starts a media storm after admitting to a journalist that it's a bad movie and that she gave up a baby for adoption during her senior year.

Just for the Summer by Abby Jimenez (Romance) Justin's curse causes every woman he dates to find their soul mate immediately after breaking up with him, and when Emma, a woman with the same curse, reaches out, they hatch a plan to date and break up to cancel each other's curse. But with unexpected challenges, they're suddenly navigating a lot more than they expected--including catching real feelings for each other.

Somewhere Beyond the Sea by TJ Klune (Fantasy) Arthur Parnassus lives a good life, built on the ashes of a bad one. He's the headmaster of a strange orphanage on a distant and peculiar island, and he hopes to soon be the adoptive father to the six magical and so-called dangerous children who live there.

Intermezzo by Sally Rooney (Fiction) In the wake of their father's death, two brothers-successful Dublin lawyer Peter and his younger

brother Ivan, a competitive chess player--find different ways to deal with their grief, which affects not only their lives, but the lives of those they hold dear.

This untold story of the academics who became OSS spies and invented modern spycraft tells how they were able to change the course of World War II and help defeat the Nazis.

The Serviceberry by Robin Wall Kimmerer (581.63 KIM 2024)

Potawatomi environmentalist Kimmerer (Braiding Sweetgrass) explains how to orient our lives around gratitude, reciprocity and community, based on the lessons of the natural world.

The Demon of Unrest by Erik Larson (973.711 LAR 2024)

Drawing on diaries, secret communiques, slave ledgers and plantation ledgers, Larson offers a gripping account of the months between Lincoln's election and the start of the Civil War, which tore a deeply divided nation in two.

How to Winter by Kari Leibowitz (616.8527 LEI 2024)

Psychologist and winter expert Kari Leibowitz uses mindset science to help readers embrace winter as a season to be enjoyed, not endured--and in turn, learn powerful lessons that can impact our mental wellbeing throughout the year.

The Wide Wide Sea by Hampton Sides (910.92 SID 2024)

Part high-seas adventure, part examination of the Age of Exploration, this account of Captain James Cook's last voyage in 1776 charts how his overt and covert missions came to a head on the island of Hawaii and left behind a complex and controversial legacy still debated to this day.

The Backyard Bird Chronicles by Amy Tan (813.54 TAN 2024)

Mapping the passage of time through daily entries, thoughtful questions and beautiful original sketches, the best-selling author of The Joy Luck Club shares her search for solace which turned into an opportunity to connect with nature in a meaningful way and imagine the intricate lives of the birds she admired.
