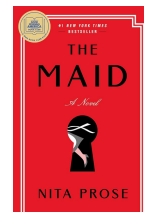
**Where the Crawdad Sings**

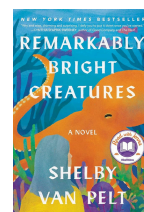
**Mad Honey** by Jodi Picoult

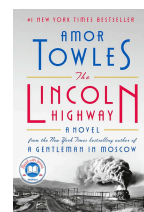
**The Maid** by Nita Prose

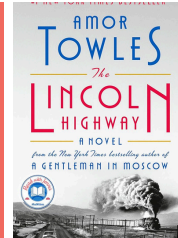
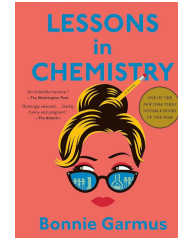
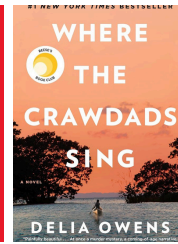
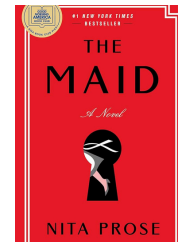
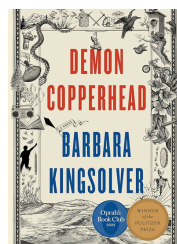
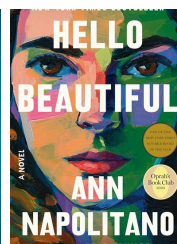
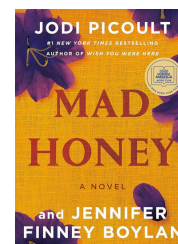
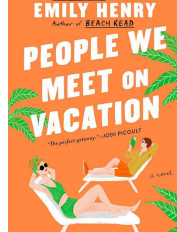
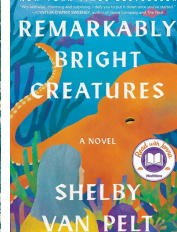
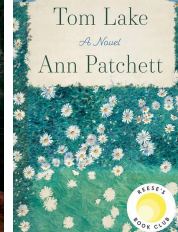
**The House in the Pines** by Ana Reyes
