1. Call to Order

Jef Treece opened the meeting, explained the agenda / meeting format and passed out copies of August meeting minutes for approval. Minutes were approved and accepted by those present.

2. Committee Updates

- Neighborhood Plan / item of interest committee. Jef Treece updated that he and Ralph Olson had volunteered to form the basis of this committee and that they planned to start work on sidewalk/pedestrian paths as this seemed to be most talked about issue currently. Jef encouraged neighbors to join the committee discussion and get involved.
- Karie Oakes and Candice Solini have formed a committee to replace the
 wooden entrance sign on Marylhurst Drive (near the hairpin turn up from
 Hwy 43). Karie encouraged at least one additional person to join the
 discussion and said they were working to identify the look and size of the
 previous sign. Teri Cummings raised the question of instead posting
 smaller neighborhood ID signs on posts throughout the area.
- 3. Treasurer's Report Jim Koll Current Balance \$5,167.08
- 4. Guest speakers: Candidates for mayor of West Linn in the November 2012 election Ron LaBlanc and John Kovash each spoke (alone without the other present) to the meeting group for 15 minutes. They each outlined their professional/personal background and reasons for running for mayor, major emphasis/viewpoint concerning the city and the city council, and why they should be elected this November.

Informational

- Karie Oakes reported on how land use activity affected MNA. The
 Mountain View property (illegal structure and fence) had announced plans
 to seek two variances but had not done so. The property at Marylhurst
 Circle/Marylhurst Drive had been deemed no longer a water resource
 issue; a building permit had been issued. Kerry will continue to follow both
 issues for MNA.
- The Election of officers for MNA will be at the October 23rd meeting.
 Current board encouraged residents to attend the meeting and vote for officers attendance would not obligate one to run for MNA board position but attendance to vote would be helpful. Anyone who wants to work as an MNA officer should contact Jef Treece by email at treece@gsp.org.
