Landscaping at Marylhurst sign

Cary Cummings reported it would take stronger measures than wood chip mulch to kill the blackberries. Digging them out would be next to impossible given the roadside condition. A member suggested exploring a method using a measured topical application of an herbicide applied to the roots below the crown. It was confirmed that we decided to hire a landscaper Cathy Boucher volunteered to ask the City if it required a licensed landscaper to do the work.

<u>Election of Officers</u> Karie Oakes, President; Tom Neff, Vice President; Sydney Potkowsky, Treasurer; Secretary vacant. Nominations remain open for Secretary.

It was moved and seconded for Ms. Potkowsky to be a signer and debit card holder on the MNA account. Motion carried. 14-0
