- 1. Introductions: Congratulations to Sarah for being reappointed to PRAB, Congratulations to Mary Baumgardner as a new PRAB member.
- 2. Approval of Tonight's Agenda: Agenda Approved
- 3. Approval of Summary Notes
 - a. Approved with changes to November 14 Draft 5a (we would get)
- 4. Community Comments:
 - a. Ed Schwarz asked that the Protocol on 3e could be changed to the beginning of the meeting like City Council.
 - b. Tom Meier talked about the timeline for the pickleball project at North Willamette and Tanner Creek Park. Talked about quotes for tensile structures. Wrote grants.
 - c. Tom Widden showed photos of tensile structure styles. Cost could be \$100,000-\$110, 000 per court.
 - d. Ken mentioned that one of the council goals is to look at year round indoor recreation opportunities.
 - e. Alma Coston thanked staff for addressing a safety hazard at the Maddax Woods trail entrance off Hood Street.
 - f. Marla Gaarenstroom came to observe the meeting.
 - g. Roger L. Woehl talked about making musical instruments and putting them in the parks. He already put one in at Hammerle Park. Would like to put some at Willamette Park, Douglas Park and Fields Bridge Park.
- 5. Items of Interest from the Board:
 - a. One more board member spot to fill. Councilor Walters thinks there may be a decision the beginning of March, after interviews.
 - b. Ken talked about an ADA transition plan, working with Public Works as a city-wide plan.
 - c. Mary asked about the Beaver Ambassador Program. Funding for these outdoor programs is not available at this time.
 - d. Tarra updated PRAB on Bee City USA process. Renewal in 2021, Bee City USA sign will be put up, programming Pollinator Week June 22-26, ongoing work with Liaisons

- c. Robinwood Station \$717,000 allocated for improvements.
- d. Old City Hall 1.26 Million allocated for renovation.
