# 2023 City Council Goal – Explore Feasibility of Indoor Recreation/Civic Center

- Explore creation of a new indoor recreation and civic center to serve a wide variety of ages, community needs, and recreation interests.
- Community and stakeholder involvement at all stages to gauge community support.
- Ensure financially sustainable operations and phased construction model.

#### • City Council members:

- Want to hear what the community will support
- Ongoing operational sustainability is critical
- Is there an opportunity for partnerships/complementing other existing facilities?
- School District:
  - Has or is building the facilities they need
  - Would be a limited partner, occasional use of a large community gathering space






#### **Other Considerations**

- Complement rather than duplicate existing facilities
- Increasing need for safe indoor spaces
  - Heat
  - Smoke/air quality
  - Pandemic/infectious disease
  - Emergency shelter
- Potential to create and support local jobs
  - Including workforce training for teens
- Keeping people in the community

### **Online Questionnaire**

- 1,843 Respondents overall
  - Nearly all homeowners
  - Similar % of retirement-age respondents to the population
  - Households with children are overrepresented

  - Arts and Crafts


















#### **Community Engagement – Phase 1 Questionnaire**



If other funding can offset some project costs, what tax payer contribution amount per month would work for you?


Cost per household based on an average assessed home value of \$427,090.


