
Q3 How do you travel along Highway 43 through West Linn most of the time?





We have walked around the Arch Bridge especially when events have occurred there, and there seems no way to really feel connected to the falls area.

Envision a Highway 43 that is more like a Main Street along it's entire length within city limits. More signals at intersections, crosswalks, ornamental lighting, median plantings, street trees, signage, etc. Consolidate commercial driveways where possible--fewer curb cuts. on 43 than say Willamette Falls main or Sisters or Ashland or any number of charming Oregon communities; but I believe it can still be beautiful, impactful and welcoming. I think encouraging walking and biking by providing safe access is job #1, and can best be achieved with a sidepath and a vegetation-filled roadway separation. Not only does this provide a safety barrier between path users and vehicles, but it is a chance for beautification. Maybe flashing speed limit signs as well? Add a consistent signage treatment for parks, landmarks, community spaces, welcome-to-the-city, etc. (maybe even bespoke street signs on 43), and you've got a corridor that is safer, stands out and makes a splash. Plant space could be carved out at intersections/intervals and be echoed across the corridor for a uniform look and feel. Finally, I would love to see something unify the various strip malls and businesses to both beautify and better weave them together. I know forced facade criteria may be a big ask, but maybe things could begin with a code that encompases new signage and requires signs to have common elements that could be applied and carried through - colors, fonts, styling, etc. Enough of those done well could begin to make a statement about the community. A little care and thought and pride can grow into something even more awesome that attracts more customers, more high quality businesses, and encourages people to get out in their community.

The traffic on 43 in the Bolton/205 area is already bad, and getting worse with more development. The priority should be to address existing safety/congestion issues FIRST. If done right, these improvements could (perhaps) accomodate more well-planned development at some point but simply tearing down homes now to bring even more people and traffic into the area - especially when tolling could still be an option that would drive even more traffic off of 205 - is completely backwards.









Q11 Which of the following most accurately describes your race and ethnic identities? (Select all that apply)




