re Vision43 Project Status Report

The purpose of this memo is to provide a general project status update for the Vision43 project and to summarize the work that the project team has completed since the previous Project Work Group (PWG) meeting on July 23, 2024. The following tasks were completed since the previous PWG meeting:

- Revised Project Vision and Goals. The project team made modest revisions to the Project
 Vision and Goals based on PWG input. The revisions incorporate language to promote
 sustainability, climate friendly practices and design, trails, focus areas and activity centers, and
 enhanced connectivity for the corridor. The revised version of the Project Vision and Goals has
 been posted on the project webpage on the City's website, which can be viewed with this link.
- Project Survey #2. The project team posted a second survey to gather community feedback
 on the project Vision and Goals. Some of the questions are also intended to gather input on
 development concepts, which will help inform Development Code updates for the corridor.
 The survey will be open until October 31.
- Engagement Events. City staff held multiple "pop ups" at various community events to
 promote the project and gather feedback from community members. Staff hosted these pop
 ups at the West Linn Senior Night Football Game, the library, Music in the Park concert series,
 the Old Time Fair, and the Farmers Market. Staff also provided project briefings at multiple
 Neighborhood Listening Sessions for the Bolton and Robinwood Neighborhood Associations.
- City Council-Planning Commission Field Trip. City staff hosted a second field trip with
 members of the City Council to tour specific sites along Lower Boones Ferry Road in Lake
 Oswego. The purpose of this trip was to visit certain areas and developments that may serve
 as a model for the City to consider for the Highway 43 corridor.
- **Draft Corridor Concepts and Visualizations.** The project team has drafted conceptual "visualizations" for specific focus areas along the corridor. The visualizations reflect community input and express potential development outcomes that could be possible under the updated Code standards for the Corridor.
