http://heritagedata.prd.state.or.us/historic/	Oregon SHPO database. You can look for specific properties or do some limited filtering to search. Also try looking under the survey (“group”) pulldown menu. Once you open up a form for a specific property, it may have links on the upper left to the survey form and a full nomination form if the property is individually listed.
https://westlinnoregon.gov/maps/historic-sanborn-maps	Sanborn Fire maps in Oregon: Sanborn maps are a very useful tool for survey/nomination work, and this link will have various dates of maps. The Oregon Historical Society also has Sanborn maps (they have original colored versions, which can provide more information!)
https://www.westlinnhistory.org/research/historic-maps	West Linn Historical Society has many old digitized survey and plat maps.
https://oregonnews.uoregon.edu/	UO’s historic newspapers of Oregon database has many older newspapers such as the Banner-Courier (Oregon City, but covered neighboring communities), searchable and it is easy to define parameters. Though you will find less available after the early 1920s, more issues are digitized all the time.

Searchable complete Oregonian to 1987 . Second link is for the other major historic Oregon newspaper; Oregon Journal .
	West Linn Tidings newspaper is not digitized, but is available on <i>microfilm</i> at the Wilsonville Library (1984-2004), at the University of Oregon Library (1985-2008), and in bound volumes at the West Linn Public Library (1984-2022) in the periodicals section.

There are two important resources available through this link; one the census data (you can look at the actual census pages) and the other is the city directories . For census data it is set up to search by name, but it sometimes works to search by address by using the street name in the “keyword” box. Remember old addresses might have changed.

https://www.ohs.org/education/digital-history-projects.cfm	Oregon Historical Society digital resources (photos, etc) available here. Also there is so much there that is not digital; you can look through their catalog online, save your list, and request the info ahead of your visit.
https://www.clackamas.us/recording	In Clackamas county there is nothing online that can help track ownership/deeds . The records are on microfiche and there is a small research area there.
https://earthexplorer.usgs.gov/	USGS aerial map series can be searched by address and date. Many of them are from very high up, but sometimes you can find relatively clear photos of development and historical landscapes. Particularly useful if you are working in unincorporated or rural areas.
https://library.uoregon.edu/map/map_resources/topo_lists	UO library USGS topographic map series (recent and historic). Digitally at TopoView site or at other links provided on UO site. Most nominations will require a USGS map OR a Google Earth screenshot.

https://efiles.portlandoregon.gov/Search	City of Portland archives may have some resources on West Linn. There's a fair amount of information that is digitized (you can also make an appointment to visit there at PSU campus and they have TONS that is not digitized)- try a search using just a street name.

Find out the ancestral tribal presence in the area you are surveying. Start with the resources at left (Oregon based)- research the original people and what happened to them as settlers came. This could also help you recommend an archaeological survey, if development or digging will follow your survey work!
