I would like to take this opportunity to encourage the City of West Linn Planning Commission to approve the West Linn/Wilsonville School District's request for an alteration to a Conditional Use Permit, Class II Design Review, and two Class II Variances for proposed modifications to the campus of West Linn High School.

More importantly, I would like to urge the Planning Commission's support for the school district's obligation of increasing parking capacity on the campus of West Linn High School pursuant to Community Development Code Chapter 46, specifically CDC 46.090

Applicable Criteria: CDC 46 Off-Street Parking, Loading and Reservoir Areas

: CDC 46.090 Minimum Off-Street Parking Space

Requirements

* B - Commercial Recreation

* 1 - Auditorium, stadium, gymnasium

* One space for each 4 seats, or eight feet of bench

length, or 1 space for each 40 square feet of floor area.

Base Proposal: "...64 new parking stalls north of the

stadium,..."

Add Alt A: "...proposed Add Alt A will include an addition of 34 parking spaces to the parking lot north of the stadium."

Add Alt B: "...proposed Add Alt B will be an expansion of the south parking lot to add 18 new parking stalls."

For several decades the residential area in the immediate area of West Linn High School has been subjected to the impacts of high-density parking during extra curricular events (see attached photos). Demand for additional parking when classes are in session has resulted in the vilification of residential neighbors of West Linn High School because of their reluctance to become willing recipients of the negative impacts of high-density on-street parking. The West Linn/Wilsonville School District has been in great need of increased parking capacity on the campus of West Linn High School, and the district's plans for expansion of the south parking lot as well as

the creation of a new parking lot off of Skyline Drive as it relates to stadium expansion addresses this necessity. Therefore, after thorough review, I would encourage the Planning Commission's approval of the West Linn/Wilsonville School District's request for an alteration to a Conditional Use Permit, Class II Design Review, and two Class II Variances for proposed modifications to the campus of West Linn High School as well as the district's commitment of increasing parking capacity on the campus of West Linn High School.

We have been at full capacity for years when there are extra curricular activities, going on.for an event. Parking is already very tight on the narrow street of Buse. A large high school bus has a very difficult time making a turn to the left if there are cars parked along Broadway. Buse St. which runs in front of my home. With games going on gets cars on both sides. Ofen blocking a residence driveway. This street is older and more narrow. I honestly do not think you could get a fire truck through here if indeed there was a need to in case of emergency.

The school needs to create available parking on the premises if indeed they are adding more seats to the stadium. In case of emergency evacuation alone and safety. It's necessary to allow space to exit and get to a safe area. Overcrowding the area and neighborhood. Simply would not allow for access to emergency vehicles alone.

I appeal to your sense of how very necessary it is to take all of this into the scope. Before making decisions that could indeed not only impact lives. But the peace, safety and rights of personal homeowners.

Thank You Mr. Myers for your consideration. I just know you will help to make a safe, healthy conscious resolution to this ever expanding parking situation. When we simply are out of space and room.
