> I'm writing to you as the owner of the property located at 1566 Willamette Falls Dr.

> Since the renovation of Willamette Falls Dr. last year, we have been enjoying a residential, quiet, and lovely business environment around us. The newly built sidewalk gives local citizens the opportunity to enjoy an afternoon stroll with their children and family. The old town restaurants are also places for gathering and dining and are suitable for a small community - we all are grateful for this.

> Lately, I've heard that the new owners of the gas station next door to my property have decided to use it as a food cart pod with indoor and outdoor seating. I am personally opposed to this for the following reasons:

> 1- Downtown West Linn/Willamette is a small residential area with limited businesses. Food cart installations are more suitable for larger plots of land in populated and industrial areas.

- > 2- With regards to the security and safety of local residents, the premises around 1590 Willamette Falls Dr. are mostly residential with children. In fact, there is a daycare less than 500 feet from the proposed land.
