TRANSPORTATION ADVISORY BOARD MEETING Summary Notes

1. Call to Order and Introductions

Called to order by Greg at 6:05pm

2. Review and approval of July 2021 Summary Notes

Chris motioned to approve, Andrew seconded. Unanimous approval.

3. Business:

a) I-205 Update

A short overview presentation was given by representatives from ODOT on the improvements and widening of I-205, specifically phase 1-A which they expect to begin in summer of 2022. The project will add a third lane of travel, will improve travel time, and strengthened the Abernethy Bridge to earthquake standards.

b) Discussion of November 2021 meeting date

Because the meeting date falls on Thanksgiving the Board will reschedule for December 9th 2021.

c) Review of progress on TAB/Council Goals Staff reviewed the progress of goals.

Advocating against tolling on I-205 project, pursuing funding for the HWY 43 and Willamette Falls Drive project, continuing work on the 2018 GO Bond projects, continuing on bond projects at the staff level, continuing to look for funding for arterial roads. The council has also asked the board to explore improvements to public and multimodal transportation. The county and TriMet are looking at an intercity shuttle between Oregon City, West Linn, and Tualatin. City council

amended the transportation system plan with approved and adopted the concept plan for Willamette Falls Drive. Staff updated the board on the city electric charging infrastructure. There is an electric charging station now in place at city hall, the city is waiting on a part to come in, and it will be available to the public. The city has taken possession of 2 electric vehicles and has an additional 3 electric F-150 on preorder, making progress toward electrification of the city's light duty fleet. Safe Routes to school update: handicap ramps are done at Suncrest, a RFP is planned at Suncrest at Hidden Springs. The street next to Sunset Primary and Sunset Park needs to have the sewer line redone before the city can do sidewalks. The safe route at Cedar Oak is more challenging due to the nature of the road and its lack of being centered in the ROW.

4. Board/Discussion/Announcements

Greg brought up Metro's TPAC / DLCD document about multimodal travel. Staff will ask someone from the city planning department to discuss and give an update to the board.

5. Public Comments

Residents Jennifer Aberg, Michelle Joslin, Phyllis Koessler, and Samantha Faile spoke to their concerns regarding the 4th Ave street development. 1310 9th St is owned and there is a land use partition in effect, and moving forward the owner plans on dividing the land into two lots in accordance with the city's land use code. With the city's current code requirements, when the property is developed, the owner will be required to do improvements along the frontage and a street would be created.
