(Attachment of my Request for Traffic Control Investigation / Improvement) "I've lived on Greene St for over 12 years now. Along the years I've seen changes on our street, some natural, some not so much. Traffic increase followed by well over the limit high speed are currently not only a nuisance but also a concerning problem, specially approaching the intersection of Greene and Barnes Circle - my property is located across it.

As we know, the max speed limit on residential areas is 25 mph; nevertheless, it is not rare for vehicles to reach 45-50 mph up and down Greene, endangering not only children with their electric bikes and scooters but also moms walking with their babies on strollers and people crossing it; the problem is aggravated due to the street's abnormal width.

Before we all feel sorry for an inevitable first victim and given that the City will most certainly not agree with the installation of speed bumps, I was thinking if they would agree with putting 25 mph speed limit signs along the street as well as a stop sign on the east corner of Greene and Barnes; it would at least help remedy the problem.

Also, with the improvements done on Salamo Rd, it has been somewhat difficult to exit Greene to go down to 10th St. Vehicles speeding at 40-45 mph down on Salamo take around 5 secs after the last curve to reach Greene and there's simply not enough time to avoid the inevitable tailgate and traffic rage...I wonder if the City would agree to put a 25 mph or a "Caution Vehicles Exiting" sign before the mentioned curve."
