I-205 Widening and Seismic Improvement Project will address congestion and traveler safety issues on a seven mile stretch of I-205 between Stafford Road and OR 213.

Project topics discussed included: The latest developments, OR 43 Interchange Design, Noise Wall Analysis, Costs, and Public Input; as well as, details surrounding improvements to the Abernathy Bridge, and tolling.

Emergency Preparedness (Judy Wiechmann)

## Old Business:

## 1) Neighborhood Association Stipends

Lengthily discussions within the Neighborhood Presidents Council resulted in proposed changes to the City Code regarding allocation of, and accountability for, Neighborhood Association stipends are completed. The bottom line (well into the weeds) under the new proposals is, ...the Robinwood NA will lose \$2.53 per year.

2) **Curbs, Sidewalks and Street Improvement Permit Conditions** (remodel/replace) The issues and apparent inconsistencies surrounding the City's requirement to require home owners to install, curbs, sidewalks and street improvements as the result of remodel or replacement permits were discussed at length.

Due to the importance of the issues and subsequent impact to the Neighborhood, a motion was made and a unanimous vote cast "...to instruct the President of the Association to send a letter to the Mayor, with copies to Members of the City Council, explaining the problem; suggest remedial actions, and extend an invitation to the Mayor and Councilors to join the neighbors at the June meeting; further, to express the desire of the neighbors to offer their assistance in reaching a sound, final, and equable decision...".
