Minutes September 11th, 2018

Call to Order, Agenda Review, and Introductions:

- Meeting of the Robinwood Neighborhood Association (RNA) called to order at 7:01pm. Agenda approved as written.
- New members to introduce: Brian Wilson (Mapleton).

Guests of the Association:

Ms. Jamie Poole, Clackamas County Disaster Management Communications and Technology Coordinator Disaster include: flooding, fire, wind, water treatment plant being compromised, earthquakes, medical emergencies, manmade, landslides, volcano, tsunamis. Some readiness ideas:

- Consider having a 'go bag' containing all your important paperwork (e.g., scan documents and put on thumb drive), information and supplies.
- Plan to have supplies to last 2-4 weeks.
- Winter storms/trees/wind: check landscaping and reduce dead trees, create defensible space so no combustibles right next to the house.
- When at the coast, look at the tsunami inundation area map to locate your evacuation route beforehand, keep your flashlight and cell phone close to you.
- Kit supplies can include: backpack, poncho, tools, drinking water, emergency blanket, duct tape, hygiene pack, but personal items too such as extra medicine
- Twin bucket emergency toilet: One bucket for pee (dilute urine and pour in yard) and one for poo (cover with shredded paper, wood ash or sawdust and when half full, bag it up and place out of the way. Seats for the buckets can be purchased.
- You can access the water in your water heater might be good to use a filter.
- Food: canned food but make sure you rotate in fresh, freeze-dried food has a longer shelf life.
- Storing your supplies: how accessible will it be after things have fallen over, against an outer wall, garage.
- Pets: one gallon per person per day, plus pets. Also have extra food for them. Have a crate for them if you have to travel or take to a shelter. Have a picture with your pet as proof that the animal is yours.

- Emergency Preparedness: (Judy Wiechmann): Contact Judy if interested in hosting a Map Your Neighborhood meeting.
- Robinwood Station: (Randall Fastabend): Repair Fair 9/22. McKenzie had first meeting with the Station to discuss code requirements. Preschool will stay at present location and not at the Station. The outbuilding will be cleaned out and used for

storage and other plans. Upcoming events: chili cook off and pumpkin carving contest 10/27, 6:00pm. Picnic (8/25/18): Fed 140 people. Zero waste with only one trash bag. Linn City Pub washed all the dishes.

- Parks and Rec: (Jim for Don Kingsborough): No haunted trail this year (city Staff is too busy after the Go Bond was funded). 42 people at the last SOLV party. Master Plan was not approved by City Council so it will be reworked. Warrior on Water yoga on paddle board could be lessons available. November ballot issue: will seismic testing be allowed at West Bridge park.
- Community Garden: (Lisa Clifton): The garden is flourishing. 18 Lewis and Clark students volunteered in garden on 9/1 and were very productive. We have a few gardeners joining the group more are welcome.
- Public Works: (Tony Bracco): Deferred.

Old Business:

- Public Works (Don/Lisa): For years, either the County or City have cut the brush on the sides of the streets but that stopped 18 months ago. Brush and blackberries are growing onto the roadway. They have also cut back on working in MSY Park so there is a lot of debris on the edge of the streets which washes into the river. On the City website, they indicate that the streets will be swept monthly but that doesn't appear to be happening. When they aren't swept, it becomes a safety issue because bikes and pedestrians have to walk in the travel lane. City Staff is not responding to calls. Don proposes to write a letter of complaint to the City. President O'Toole will write a letter and invite City Staff to our next meeting.
- Neighborhood Plan (Streets and Sidewalks): President O'Toole will need to gather more information before proceeding.
