April 11th 2023 Meeting

Meeting Called to Order by Tony Bracco at 7:09 pm

New attendees: Matt Jacobson at 4040 Kenthorpe and Brian Goldberg on Trillium.

Agenda: Motion by Carol Bryck, second by Dennis Pollmann, approved by acclamation.

Guest Speakers: Mayoral candidates Rory Bialostosky and Bill Relyea:

Rory: Graduated WLHS 2018, Lewis & Clarke in 2022, on council since 2021. Current issues: lobbying for water funding for \$14 million bridge pipeline bill from ODOT. Fighting against ODOT tolling scheme with two toll scanners in West Linn. Senate bills to prohibit tolling on 205. Projects 100% traffic increase on WM Falls. Community visioning for new Rec Center in West Linn, perhaps onboard a consultant. Community visioning for Waterfront Project. Community visioning for Hwy 43.corridor. Term for 18 months for remainder of terms. RoryforWL.com.

Bill: On council for 4.5 years. Wants mayors office in city hall with door open to public for better communicatio. Supports bills for moratorium on local tolling, alternative to toll Columbia bridges first. Worked on numerous ODOT products and tolling was never discussed on these projects. Money for ODOT by other means. ODOT report to appointed Transportation Commission which reports to legislature. Senate bill 74 to criminalize sex crimes by professional misrepresentation. Police over site and accountability procedures, with group in public process, things that can change now versus those that need changes in union agreements or changes to state and federal laws.

Both candidates agree that OR43 Intersections issue is on informal hold and requires a future public process. Both agree on need for charter review.

Don Schumaker, running for WLWV School Board, retired as Principal of Wilsonville High School.

Luke Borland on Public Works summer paving projects: 16 days in MSYoung parking and 12 days on Cedar oak boat ramp then 2" overlay on Cedar oak and Terra Vista Court with excavation in trouble spots. Single lane road closures as construction go down street. Park projects must be done before July 1st due to FEMA funding. Cars with roof racks for kayaks are clear in trailer spots since judge considers those as qualifying. Sidewalk update supposed to be done by June with drainage issues. Issue raised that trailers are harder to park in the neighborhood.

March Minutes: Motion by Mary HILL, second by Carol Bryck, approved by acclamation.

Treasurer's Report: No changes, balance is \$3886.15 per Treasurer Jim O'Toole.

Public Comments: Lori Griffith: WRA on Kenthorpe has some errors that require correction. City planner Gardner should require re-submittal. 10th Annual national 'Play Music on the Porch Day' on August 26th, proposing event at Robinwood Station and a Family Game Night. Lori volunteers to help on both.

Mary Robinson on Next Door with campers in MSYoung. Community Cleanup on April 1st.

Committee Reports: OR43 Intersections committee needs to polish presentation for council.

Announcements, City and Community Events: RNA vice president Carol Bryck appointed to Citizen Budget Committee.

Earth Day April 22nd at WACH with table at event for Station and Garden. Nearly 14 years since Station opened for inspection. Station Grand Opening Sunday June 4th. Repair Fair and Recycling on July 22nd. Blood Drive quarterly starting May 3rd from 1-6pm.

TerryWise is a new city IT manager and attended to see the Station facility.
