Planning presentation: Allison Morton, Executive Director for Bright Schoolhouse use at 19066 Willamette Drive: Former Ballet Theater space behind Chase Bank. Self paced education for active learners from kindergarten to 2nd grade. More alternative learning structure. Operated by non-profit. E occupancy in retail space with some higher requirements, No changes to site plan or exterior of building, adding restroom and art sink in interior. 8am start time prior to retail use and 3pm pickup before peak evening traffic. Property good for safety of school.

City Council Update by interim councilor Carol Bryck: Work session on October 2nd regarding to changes to council rules due to pushback at August 7th council meeting. Primarily because council meeting were running very late in evening. Other cities have more restrictive comment requirements.
