City Council Candidate Introduction: Brian Beedle - Family new to West Linn 2 yrs ago from Santa Clarita, CA. Worked in entertainment and health care finance. Priorities: Insuring safety of families, Being an unbiased non-partisan voice for West Linn. Establish Neighborhood Watch, fostering economic growth, supporting local businesses. Representation - Know where tax dollars are going, Hwy 43 repair, Hatcheries promoting tourism. Environment and native species. Serve as unbiased community activist and advocate. Balance economic growth versus preserving character.

Kevin Bonnington - Current interim councilor, a humbling experience; cool thing to do. Raised in WL, lived heres except 3 years. Started with fundraising for skate park with local bands playing at Sunset Fire Hall. In 2021 joined TAB becoming familiar with issues, then joined Planning Commission for one year.. Real estate broker specializing in first time home buyers. Local city politics working better than larger bodies. Many things in city going very well. Opportunity to show how serious about the job and build relationships. Responding to all emails, to be accessible. Excited about Wm Falls re-development opportunity. Concerned regarding Farley case. Livability looking out 50 years. Lacking will to fund aquatic facility.

Treasurer's Report: Balance is \$4376.91 No expenditures.

Vision 43 Outreach by Chris Myers: Working on a 2 year project looking at land uses adjacent to corridor. Started engagement process committed to 30 events to elicit feedback. Robinwood and Bolton touch the corridor therefore listening sessions with MIG outside regular NA meeting for all 4 listening sessions. Cards to be mailed out to invite, Website up with survey, interactive map and schedule of events. First listening session tentatively May ?. Dawn Meaney and 3? others from Robinwood on Working Group. Everyone welcome to listen in to 6 meetings. What do we want 43 to look like over next decades with zoning changes. 1231 addresses in Robinwood so looking for bigger venue. January '25 will do Tax Incremental Financing feasibility study. MIG task is to write new development code. Package of changes that must go through city council. Concurrent discussion of 43 transfer. Infill housing discussion ensued.
