Luke Borland, City of West Linn - Cedaroak Safe Sidewalks update:

The crossings and the underground are all finished. By this coming Friday all of the North side cement pouring will be finished. Next week will go as follows, all things permitting:
Monday: general cleanup. Tuesday: base pavings/re-pavings. Wednesday: milling the top 2" (per plan). There will be more milling required towards Trillium. Thursday: brand new asphalt Striping is to take place a couple of weeks after the asphalt is down. Typically, it takes 2-3 weeks to cure. They will wait until October to plant trees and green space areas as it is typically a better time to plant then currently. Currently waiting on a response from an electrician to install the flashing beacon and are hopeful to have it in place by Aug., 27th. Project will be paving to the existing limit or, in some cases, slightly past. There are areas of the road currently that look to sit very high. These areas had to be raised to meet proper grade under PROMAG— a federal law that says anything in the right of way has to be brought to ADA standards. A site walk makes sense for October before dusk to catch the project in its finished state. A reception with the city and public to discuss the project's wrap up can be coordinated.

Luke Borland, City of West Linn - Calaroga Pump Station Update

The city is moving the sewer plant out of the flood plain as it is past its service life and currently, very difficult to access. The project will take roughly a year to complete with the biggest impact to residents being the first 3 months where a road closure on Calaroga is necessary. They hope to keep the current pump station working while they complete the first part of the project. They hope to have this completed before winter weather is here. The end result will have a gabion wall and native plant replanting to help hide the wall over time. From the road all that will be visible is a manhole and a small pullout.
