## Savanna Oaks Neighborhood Association Meeting October 4th, 2016 at 7:00 PM

## Minutes

Meeting was called to order at 7:01 pm by SONA Secretary, Roberta Schwarz

In attendance were 19 people total. They included 15 members of SONA. There was one person who was a visitor from Willamette NA. There was also a guest speaker, Rita Moore, from Yes on Measure 97. Two teenaged children of one of the members were also present.

Meeting minutes from the September meeting were approved with a unanimous vote.

SONA Treasurer, Patrick McGuire, reported that the current SONA balance is unchanged at \$3,422.80.

## **Old Business:**

1. An update was given by Roberta Schwarz on the White Oak Savanna's fundraisers planned for October, November, and December. They include the Holiday Craft Fair on November 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> and two Burgerville fundraisers on October 12th and December 14<sup>th</sup>. The fundraising for the lower six acres of the White Oak Savanna will be successfully completed by December.

## **New Business:**

- 1. Rita Moore, a representative from the ballot measure Yes on 97, made a five-minute presentation and then answered questions from the members for another approximately 10 minutes.
- 2. A ballot vote was taken for SONA officers for a two-year term. Ed Schwarz was elected for President. Ken Pryor was elected for Vice President. Patrick McGuire was elected for Treasurer. Roberta Schwarz was elected for Secretary. All four people were elected unanimously. They were each the only nominee for their respective office.
- 3. There was an excellent discussion of possible questions for the upcoming League of Women's Voters forum to be held on October 20<sup>th</sup> at 7 pm at City Hall. Each NA has been asked to submit three questions. There were eight questions offered so it was decided that they would be written up and emailed to those who had been in attendance so that the members could each vote for their favorite three and then the results would be tabulated and those three with the highest number of votes would be submitted to represent SONA.

Roberta Schwarz, seeing no further business, adjourned the meeting at 8:00 pm.
