Savanna Oaks Neighborhood Association Meeting October 3rd, 2017 at 7:00 PM

Minutes

Meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by SONA Secretary, Roberta Schwarz

In attendance were 24 people. Nineteen were members of SONA. The three guest speakers Christine Kennedy and Marjorie Synakienwicz of WLLO Village and Andrew Tull of 3 J Consulting were also in attendance. One guest from Willamette NA and one from Marylhurst NA were also present.

Meeting minutes from the September meeting were approved with a unanimous vote.

SONA Treasurer, Patrick McGuire, reported that the current SONA balance is \$3,423.31

Old Business:

 An update was given by Roberta Schwarz on the Natural Play Area in the White Oak Savanna. There was also an update on two future fundraisers and there was a description given of the Ribbon Cutting Celebration that happened on September 30th at the Savanna.

New Business:

- 1. The two representatives named above, Christine and Marjorie, from WL/LO Village spoke about the Aging in Place village project that is currently in the planning stages. The cost would be \$500 per year and several services would be offered so that people could stay in their homes as they get older. One of the major ones would be transportation. Brochures were passed out. They can be reached at 503 504 2985. Several questions were asked and answered.
- 2. The annexation application for the Sloop property was discussed by Andrew Tull, the land use consultant from 3 J Consulting who is named above. He can be reached at 503 946 9365 (ext. 203). The Sloops were also in attendance. Several questions were asked and answered. The pre-application conference was brought up by a member as well as the fact that the neighboring property, owned by Mr. McKune, might also be included in the annexation application process.
- 3. A letter was passed out by Roberta Schwarz and discussed. The letter, which had blank lines ready for signatures, addresses and the date, requests that the Mayor and City Council put the Sloop and/or McKune property annexations up for an advisory vote of the people. Several questions were asked and answered and 13 people in attendance signed one of the letters and handed it in to Roberta.

4. Ken Pryor handed out information about the upcoming ballot measure concerning the City's legal services. The Arguments Against were discussed and questions were asked and answered.

Roberta Schwarz, seeing no further business, adjourned the meeting at 8:35 pm.
