## Savanna Oaks Neighborhood Association Meeting January 2nd, 2018 at 7:00 PM

## Minutes

Meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by SONA President, Ed Schwarz

In attendance were 26 people. Fourteen were members of SONA. Ten guests were in attendance from Willamette NA and two representatives came from ODOT.

Meeting minutes from the December meeting were approved with a unanimous vote.

SONA Treasurer, Patrick McGuire, reported that the current SONA balance is \$3,423.31

A local Boy Scout from Troop 149, Evan McKinley, had a Community Comment and made a brief request that one of the trails in the White Oak Savanna be named after the founder of the Boy Scouts, Robert Baden Powell. A unanimous vote was taken to approve the request if it meets with Park standards. There have been several Boy Scout projects in the Savanna and more are planned. The signage will match the existing signs in the Savanna and Evan will coordinate with Roberta Schwarz on this with the approval of the Parks Department.

## Old Business:

1. An update was given by Roberta Schwarz about a fundraiser for the White Oak Savanna. On January 29<sup>th</sup> from 5 until 11 pm the McMenamins in West Linn will have a Friends and Family Night for the Savanna with 50% of the proceeds being donated.

## **New Business:**

- The challenge issued by the City of West Linn for the Neighborhoods to have a
  friendly competition to see which one would donate the most items to the
  Clackamas County Women's Services last month resulted in SONA tying for first
  place with Rosemont Summit NA. Congratulations to each of these NAs for their
  generosity.
- 2. An update was given by Ed Schwarz on the Development Agreement Hearing which has been postponed until February 12<sup>th</sup>.
- 3. An update was given by Ed Schwarz on a request made to the Neighborhood Association Presidents that NAP funds being refunded to the individual NAs from the reserve fund be used to have Carole Connell, City Planner, do an update of her 2004 and 2005 analysis of the costs to citizens for houses that are built in West Linn.

4. Two representatives of ODOT made a 30-minute presentation on the possible widening of I 205 from Stafford Rd to OR 99E. Materials were handed out and questions were asked and answered during the video presentation.
