- IV. **Mayor Jules Walter Presentation** – Update on the City:
 - a. Debris pick-up could cost \$1.5 to \$2.00 million.
 - b. Communication during ice storm improvements:
 - i. AM radios may be given out.
 - ii. Hiring an Emergency Coordinator.
 - iii. Post Office, back to WL, city attorney now involved, on City Council agenda for discussion.
 - iv. Interim Police Chief doing great, city has hired an outside firm in searching for a new police Chief.
 - v. City is excited for the infrastructure to start and work to begin.
- V. **Other City Business:**
 - a. ODOT has not decided on where the permanent tolls will be on 205, there are still town halls to be held.
 - b. Parking on Main Street will be reversed from back in parking to front end parking, and bike bath will be outlined in green paint.
- VI. **Rebecca Presentation for Main Street Update:**
 - a. Rebecca just returned from a Main Street Conference.
 - b. The business grants were a huge and extremely successful.
 - c. Unfortunately, the Old Time Fair 2021 is cancelled.
 - d. Rebecca will also be designing a downtown map that will showcase benches, garbage cans, and restaurants with their outdoor seating.
 - e. Banners will be displayed on light poles; they are double sided.

- f. Starting on June second, the beginning of the Farmer's Market which will run April through August 4:30 – 7:30 near Cider & Ale house. Location is being secured (more farmer applicants than space.)
- g. The St. Patrick's Day event was successful and will kick off the third Wednesday event which will run March – November.
