WNA President, Kathie Halicki, called the meeting to order at 7pm. The Minutes of April 10, as shown on the WL Meetings website, were approved. The Treasury continues with a balance of \$2,368.66

The WL Food Pantry: a motion to donate \$500 to the Food Pantry was seconded and passed. Debbie Myers thanked the group and said a recent food drive had brought in 1800 lbs. Also many people drop off food items.

Public Works: Erich Lais presented up dates for the Athey Creek round about construction and for changes at 9th street.

9th street now has a speed limit of 15 mph. Research is supporting a move to make the street one way downhill forcing all park traffic to exit at the opposite end of the park. **Willamette Falls Drive** will now have a sign posting 30 mph limit on west bound traffic from Fields Bridge. The proposed sidewalk will have a curb that will deter roadside parking during ball games.

Brandon Place will have gate in place soon. It is being constructed.

A Welcome to Willamette sign will be replaced soon.

Friends of West Linn Wetlands is a newly formed group to protect the beaver ponds and wetlands near the former settling pond. This group has a website with several links for further information plus many photos of wildlife in the area.

Citizen feedback may affect development decisions which are in the process.

Those present were encouraged to alert friends and neighbors to the need for feedback.

This parcel of land now held in private ownership and including the holding pond was formerly owned by WES and offered to West Linn. Because of the complexity and cost of toxic cleanup, the city chose not to purchase.

56 duplex townhomes being planned for the slope between the beaver ponds and 5th Avenue. Residents in the area say the road cannot accommodate the potential car traffic and the terrain does not allow a much wider road.

This group would like to hear from any persons with expertise on wetlands, beavers, and/or riparian development.

36 interested persons attended the recent pre-App with the developer, Mr. Schulz. Interest and action among WL residents is very important and timely.

President's comments: some Willamette NA meeting signs have gone missing during the pandemic. Please look in your garages, etc.

iCon proposed construction at 12th and WF Drive will proceed with its roof addition with the stipulation that noise be minimized.

In the building proposed across from the food carts, parking slots have been reduced from 8 to 6. A breezeway will connect the existing home with the adjacent new two story structure.

Further lot divisions are proposed for 5th street and for Blankenship.

Boat Parking extended hours to 24 are being discussed in City Council. In addition RV's and other large vehicles need to be accommodated, Road width may be determining factor. Clarification is coming.

Tuesday, May 14: Savannah Oaks NA and Willamette NA will host a zoom candidates forum. Presubmitted questions will be given to each City Council candidate.

Thursday, May 23: will be an informational meeting for a WL recreational center held at the Adult Community Center.
