

The meeting was called to order by President Kathie Halicki at 7:01

The **minutes** as appeared on the WL Meetings page were approved.

The **treasury** remains at \$3,503.17

Police Chief Otis Rollins introduced himself. He was with the Tigard Police force for 11 years before coming to West Linn for the last 11 years. He said Chief Mahuna was an excellent mentor.

There are 3 officers on duty at any time during the day and night with a total of 29 officers. They drive around the City because their presence has proved to reduce crime and vandalism. Willamette had 82 incidents in 2025 mostly because it is near the freeway and has several through streets. Most crimes are property related.

Because 3 officers must be available 24/7 there is often overtime required to cover any absences. There is one policemen designated for schools and he is at the high school mostly, Chief Rollins hopes to visit grade schools so students can be used to police as nice helpful people,

Q: tagging and spray can art? Usually more frequent in the summer

Q: use of golf carts? Oregon law allows carts adjacent to golf courses only. A slow moving vehicle must have license plates, a wind screen and turn signals to drive on public roads.

Q: I.C.E. activity? WL has not had any incidents yet. WL is a sanctuary city and will not assist federal events.

Q: Unhoused people? We have few if any because we have few services

Q: sexual assault response training? Yes, assault, trauma and domestic abuse training is active and ongoing.

West Linn Lions has existed since 1953 and contributed to West Linn ever since. Funds from hamburger sales and special events go back to the City for the library and the Food Pantry. There are funds available in trust for scholarships for high school students.

The Food Pantry thanks residents that continue to drop off non-perishable food at their several locations. The Pantry's clientele is growing.

WLWV SCHOOL BOARD RECALL petitions are available for the recall of all five Board members. Residents are asked to sign all five petitions before May 11. An event is planned at Robinwood Station on April 18 from 11 to 3.

The recall is based on promises unkept, school closures and poor financial policy

Main Street has a busy St Patrick's day planned with vendors. The Summer Market will have 78 vendors. A newsletter was passed around with new businesses highlighted. A wine walk is scheduled for May 11.

Lastly, Tri Met will be cutting services due to low ridership and financial constraints. However SMART will extend service to WL with a stop at McDonalds on 8th Ct.

Update: NAP met recently with a new president from Robinwood. Since attendance is irregular with the NAs, some are considering combining: Rosemont, Hidden Springs and Parker Crest. Skyline Ridge has no treasurer.
