

The meeting was called to order by President Kathie Halicki at 7:05.

The **minutes** as appeared on the West Linn Meetings page were approved.

The **treasury** has a continuing balance of \$3,211.92

Presentation: Council President, Mary Baumgardner, described 'Framing our Future' as a program to solicit comments from the West Linn community on how funds should be spent in the future. A survey is available on the City's website under 'our West Linn'. Priorities from infrastructure to street repair are listed. Responses are coming in but more are encouraged.

Presentation: Nicholas Compton, resident of West Linn and PSU senior, is taking a class in urban communications. He would like to gather opinions on art as a vehicle for communication, specifically a mural on public property.

comments:

1.The WL Arts Commission seems to be focused on its own projects

2. There is space for a mural on a large retaining wall in Field's bridge Park.

Perhaps remarks and suggestions could be solicited from the public who use the park via a 'comment board'.

3. The Historic Review Board and Historic Main Street could be helpful.

4. A 3 city art project (WL, OS, OC) is underway including the Highway 43 corridor.

Land Use: Proposed 940sqft addition at 1819 4th Avenue is within the historic review district. Projects under 1000sqft do not come before the WNA.

Comments: Clackamas county has a preparedness program called CLACKGOP on line with maps, tips for emergencies, fire prevention and preparedness, ie: clean debris from gutters, remove plant material close to structures.

Request to buy better quality technical materials for our meetings. Camera, speakers, microphone cost will be appx \$350.

'Backyard Habitat' documentation is available with emphasis on native plants.

Perhaps the WNA with other NAs should have a table at the Summer Market to promote attendance.

The fishing platform at Field's Bridge Park has been closed off for several years. When will it be fixed for use again?

Could the 'Sentinel' heron sculpture be returned to its original place at the entrance to Field's bridge Park where it will be more visible.

Should/could our Willamette Park be renamed to avoid confusion with the park on Macadam Blvd in Portland? Perhaps Tualamette would be an option?

The meeting adjourned at 7:50.
